or clowns, which are funny. The artists ride their own floats throwing beads to	11
cheering crowds providing an entertaining and colourfull spectacle.	12

Mardi Gras is French for 'Fat Tuesday', reflecting the practice of eating rich, fatty	14
food on the last night before the ritual fasting during the Lent season.	15
In such as the United Kingdom, Ireland, Australia and Canada, Mardi	16
Gras is also known as Shrove Tuesday, which comes from the word shrive,	17
meaning 'confess'.	18

King cake is closely associated with Mardi Gras traditions and are served	20
throughout the carnival season, which lasts from Epiphany Eve to Fat Tuesday.	21
Epiphany comes from a Greek word that means 'to show'. Jesus first showed	22
himself to the three wise men and to the world on this day. As a symbol of this	23
Holy Day, a tiny plastic baby is placed inside the King Cake.	24

The King Cake tradition is thought to have been brought to New Orleans from	26
France in 1870 and is an oval-shaped cake, which is a mixture of a coffee	27
cake and a French pastry. It can be made from sweet, dough topped with a glaze,	28
dried or candied fruit, or puff pastry with various fillings, such as	29
almond or chocolate. It is decorated in royal colours of purple, green and gold.	30

There are about 5,000 different species of ladybirds in the world. They are also	3
known as lady beetles or ladybugs, and in many cultures they are considered good	4
luck. They come in different colours and patterns, but the most familiar in Europe	5
is the seven-spot ladybird, which has a shiny, red and black body. Most people like	6
ladybirds because they are pretty, graceful and harmless to humans. Farmers love	7
them because they eat insects and other plant-eating pests. They live for 12 months	8
and a single ladybird's can gobble more than 5000 insects during their lifetime!	9

Most ladybirds have oval bodies with six short legs. Depending on the species,	11
they can have spots, stripes or no markings at all. Seven-spotted ladybirds are	12
black and red (or sometimes black and orange) with three spots on each side and	13
one in the middle. Their head is black with white patches. The ladybirds' bright	14
colours act as an important defence mechanism, warning animals not to eat them.	15

When threatened, the bugs release an oily, yellow fluid from the knee joints in	17
their legs which tastes disgusting.	18

These brilliant bugs have another trick to avoid danger; they remain still and	20
pretend to be dead. The main hunters of ladybirds' are birds, but they also fall	21
victim to frogs, wasps, spiders and dragonflies.	22

Ladybirds lay their eggs in clusters or rows on the underside of a leaf. Larvae, which	24
vary in shape and colour depending on the, emerge in a few days. When they	25
reached full size, they attach to a leaf by their tail, and a 'pupa' is formed. In a	26
couple of weeks, the pupa becomes an adult ladybird.	27

Ladybirds are happy in many different habitats, including grasslands, forests,	29
cities, suburbs and along rivers. They are active during spring and summer, but	30
when the weather turns colder in autumn, they look for a warm, secluded place to	31

Sultan was born on 10 December 1982, and was not a particularly large baby but he started growing very tall when he was 10 years old. The rest of his family, including his parents and four siblings, are all average size.

Sultan's massive height is caused when the body produces an excess of growth hormone, resulting in the overgrowth and thickening of bones and muscles which after time causes painful joints and enlarged hands and feet.

He loves basketball and as a teenager, Sultan was signed to the Galatasaray basketball team, but unfortunately was too tall to play. Due to his extreme size, Sultan wasn't able to finish school and so became a farmer in order to support his family.

He says one of the advantages of being tall is being able to change an electric light bulb, paint a ceiling and hang curtains without ladders. He doesn't mind being tall but finds it difficult to buy clothes or shoes that fit and says it is extremely hard to fit into a regular-size car.

He said "I'd also like the chance to find some decent clothes that fit! I've already had a suit made for me, and at least one dream has come true: I now own a pair of jeans made especially for me!"

Sultan also holds the record for having the largest hands on a living person; each hand measures 28.5cm from the wrist to the tip of the middle finger. His left foot measures 36.5cm and his right foot measures 35.5cm.
